## Q. What is it? Downtown Bazaar by WEDI

**A.** An international food hall with retail sponsored and supported by Westminster Economic Development Initiative (WEDI) with some restaurateurs from the former West Side Bazaar.

## Where is it located?

Downtown Buffalo, right next to the Market Arcade

## When is it open/hours of operation?

We are not yet open. The soft opening will be mid-February Hours of operation are currently planned for M-F; 8 am to 8 pm

## How did we get there?

In the aftermath of the fire at the West Side Bazaar on Grant Street, Amy Nagy, a former Sinatra & Company Real Estate vice president, got the space on WEDI's radar. Two of the restaurants (Abyssinia and Nile River) and two of the retail businesses (The Asian Boutique and Flavia's Business) from the old West Side Bazaar are moving to the Downtown Bazaar along with two new food businesses from off the WEDI waiting list. These two new businesses were chosen from a waiting list of close to 150.
